INTRODUCTION

Which safety tips do you think EVERYONE needs to know in order to stay safe? Think about the many ways you could share safety tips with the people in your life. Follow the steps below to create a way to teach others a specific safety tip. You, too, can be a Safety Sleuth by giving others a CLUE about how to stay safe!

STEP 1: Choose a safety tip you think everyone should know. We learned A LOT of safety tips with Safety Sleuth! If you have to choose just ONE tip that you feel everyone should know, what would it be? Write a sentence explaining the safety tip you have chosen. Be sure it is clear and easy to understand. STEP 2: Decide the details you will communicate about this safety tip.

Take time to explain the details about your safety tip. Answer each question below to help you to communicate the details about your safety tip. Feel free to add more details as needed.

- What should people know and be able to do?
- What should people look for?
- What should people do to stay safe?
- What should people do if they do not feel safe in this situation?
- Why is this an important safety tip?
- What might happen if a person does not follow this safety tip?



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STEP 3: Create your communication tool. (Choose one tool.)

There are many ways to communicate with others. Think of the best way you can share your important safety tip with others. Choose a communication tool that will help you get the attention of others so they will learn and remember your safety tip. Also, be sure to choose a communication tool that you will enjoy creating and that will appeal to your peers. Use your talents and interests to create your communication tool.

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Safety Sleuth Project HOT TIPS FOR TEACHERS

- Determine how much time you will give students to work on the project in class and how much time you would like them to work on the project at home.
- Review the five project steps with students before they begin. Check for understanding. Answer questions as needed.
- Refer students to their Safety Sleuth workbooks for ideas as they choose a safety tip in STEP 1 and write details in STEP 2.
- Give students a chance to share their ideas and plans in pairs or trios and to ask for peer feedback.
- If students feel stuck and have a hard time choosing a safety tip, direct them to explore the PSEG Long Island website for more ideas: https://www.psegliny.com/
- To encourage mastery learning, allow for students to share their projects BEFORE the presentation to receive teacher feedback so they can fix or improve their projects.
- Create a fun and celebratory environment when students present their projects.

- VARIATION: Ask students to vote for the top 5 projects to send to PSEG Long Island to represent their class.
