Dear Parent/Guardian:

Did you know your children can learn how to be safe around electricity with a **free** program offered by your electricity provider, PSEG Long Island?

Over the past five years, PSEG Long Island has educated thousands of young children in their classrooms in communities like yours through its *Safety Sleuth* program and poster project. This powerful, entertaining program helps children learn how to be safe around electricity and then puts their artistic talents to work creating informational posters about what they learned. Approximately two dozen student-made posters will be featured in a gallery exhibit at the Long Island Children's Museum in 2025. Will your child's posters be among them?

Students will learn these lessons:

- LOOK Discover many ways to "see a situation" and determine what is safe and unsafe.
- **THINK** Learn to assess situations to act responsibly and safely inside the home, and out in the community. Learn to communicate clearly with details about situations that may feel unsafe.
- **DO** Take responsibility by making informed choices about electrical safety and in other activities of daily living where safety could be an issue. Be cautious and take positive actions to ensure your safety and the safety of others.
- **SHARE** Learn how to explain to others what happened, where it happened or inform and inspire others to be careful, and explain why.
- **CREATE** Use your newfound knowledge to educate others using artistic skills.
